If you have been down to the Hosanna House or in the Kingdom Kids' Hang Out room you have probably seen our new virtue posters. Virtue Posters are a visual way to provide information on the monthly virtue. They help liven up our children's environment and create a real buzz about what's going on. These posters are designed with the visuals and humor for all ages to engage the whole family. Kids get excited about what they are going to learn, and parents are motivated to get involved in teaching their kids.

The posters usually mimic a popular movie poster. And the pretend movie credits have humorous sayings about the virtue as well.
